ASHTON OLD ROAD BETWEEN (PIN MILL BROW TO ALAN TURING WAY)



IMPROVED CYCLING FACILITIES IN YOUR AREA

Why provide cycling facilities on Ashton Old Rd?

Ashton Old Road is a key commuter route to City Centre with no existing On-Road cycling facilities. Currently there are approximately 161 cyclists per day.

Requests have been received from local cyclist to improve cycle facilities on Ashton Old Road between Pin Mill Brow and Alan Turing Way.

Following recent serious accident, at the junction of Ashton Old Road and Alan Turing Way, involving a vehicle and pedal cyclist who sustained serious head injuries, Cyclists advanced stop lines at this junction are also proposed to increase the awareness of cyclists.

Proposals Provision of advisory cycle lanes

The following route improvements are proposed along Ashton Old Road between Pin Mill Brow to Alan Turing Way.

Where possible a 1.5 metre wide advisory cycle lanes will be provided along Ashton Old Road, including the provision of full green surfacing over junctions.

The introduction of cycle advance stop lines at signalised junctions.

Areas with width constrain the provision of a minimum 1.5m cycles lane it is proposed to create a continuous route facility and highlight the presence of cyclists green coloured squares with cycle symbols and 'Route Recommended for pedal cycles' signs.
