The information provided on this application form will be used to ensure that the council's records are correct. It may also be shared with other agencies and service providers to ensure that your child receives an appropriate service. All parents need to provide attached to the application forms, a passport sized photo of the child. The child's name, date of birth should be written on the back of the photo for correctly matching the photo with the child's application form

<p>Free travel pass</p> <p>A TfGM (transport for Greater Manchester) travel pass enables the child to make a return journey to and from school on any Greater Manchester bus, tram or train. This pass is valid for one academic year.</p>		
<p>Cycle voucher</p> <p>A cycle voucher can be used to purchase a bicycle and equipment up to the value of £180 (£90 for year 11 children). Read the attached notes carefully before applying for a cycle voucher.</p>

Application for a free secondary school travel pass September 2025 to July 2026 - Notes of guidance

Please keep these notes for your information.

Who can qualify for a free travel pass / cycle voucher?

Only Manchester City Council residents can use this form to apply for a free travel pass. Travel passes will not be provided for children attending independent schools. If your child has an Education and Health Care Plan, please contact the EHCP Travel Co-ordination Unit, telephone 0161 219 6400 (calls are taken by Contact Manchester), for free travel assistance.

Where we require the distance measurement between the child's home and school, this will be measured by the shortest walking route.

To qualify for a TfGM (Transport for Greater Manchester) free travel pass or cycle voucher from Manchester City Council, the child must be aged 11 to 16 and fall into one of these groups:

Note - The local authority expects parents to list their nearest schools on their school place application form if they intend to apply for free travel to school.

Group 1 – Looked after child

A child looked after, A child looked after from overseas or previously looked after by Manchester City Council and attending a secondary school or academy more than 2 miles from their home address.

Group 2 – Distance

A child aged 11 - 16 years old and living in Manchester who is

- attending their nearest secondary school more than 3 miles but less than 15 miles from home; and
- where nearer similar provision in a qualifying Manchester school is not available.

The definition of nearer similar provision in secondary schools for children who qualify under group 2 is defined as any school (other than the school the applicant currently attends) which may be closer to the applicants' home address.

We do not consider specialism, such as specialist technology schools or the performance of a school, or schools based on faith when looking for a 'similar' qualifying school.

A qualifying school is defined as any community schools, foundation schools, voluntary aided and voluntary controlled schools; • academies (including those which are free schools, university technical colleges, studio schools)• alternative provision academies.

Group 3 – Low income: Free School Meals / Universal Credit

A child aged 11 - 16 years old and living in Manchester who is

- Attending one of their three nearest suitable secondary schools provided it is more than 2 miles but not more than 6 miles from their home.
- Or attending a secondary school or Academy more than 2 but less than 15 miles if their preferred school is on the grounds of religion or belief from their home address; and

Where nearer similar provision in a qualifying Manchester school is not available.

Low income is defined as a pupil who receives free school meals due to low income and the family claim Universal Credit

A similar school will be defined when looking at the school(s) applied for or the school attended. If the school applied for / attended is due to its faith, then similar faith schools will be looked at when assessing Group 3.

If you are claiming Universal credit Free School Meals for your child, a full photocopy of your income related benefits (Universal Credit award) must be provided.

If you do not provide any of the above notifications, we will return your application to you unconsidered.

Group 4 – Year 10 or Year 11

A child in Year 10 or Year 11 who has

- recently moved into Manchester from another local authority and wishes to remain at their current school; and
- lives between 3 and 15 miles from their current school.

Exceptions

- (a) Route Safety - Where a child attends their nearest suitable school, and it is within the statutory walking distance of their home, and the nature of the route means they could not be expected to walk there in reasonable safety even if accompanied by their parent, and there is no alternative route within the statutory walking distance that they would be able to walk in reasonable safety, even if accompanied by their parent.
- (b) A child living in homeless families' accommodation who wishes to remain at their current school; evidence must be provided, if you do not provide evidence, your application will be returned unconsidered.

Further guidance

What if my child does not qualify for a free travel pass / cycle voucher?

You have the right to appeal the decision made if you feel your application was not considered correctly based on one or all of the following:

- Entitlement;
- Distance measured;
- Route safety;
- Consideration of exceptional circumstances that was submitted along with the original application.

If you wish to appeal, you need to write to the address below within 20 working days of the date on your decision letter along with your reasons why you feel free travel should have been issued for your child. The information received will be considered as a formal stage 1 appeal and a reviewed decision of your case will be made within 20 working days of receipt of your request.

Your written request needs to provide the details of the child(ren) concerned, including their full name, date of birth, and current address, along with any exceptional circumstances. Please send your written appeal to:

Children under 16 can travel for the concessionary fare on all buses, trains and Metrolink trams in Manchester. Children can apply for an IGO card to enable them to buy special tickets that save more money. An application form can be obtained from the Transport for Greater Manchester Office (TfGM) by telephoning 0161 244 1050.

What is a cycle voucher?

Manchester City Council offers a cycle voucher that can be put towards the cost of a bicycle and cycle equipment up to the value of £180 (£90 for year 11 children). This is as an alternative to a free travel pass for secondary age children. For children in years 7-10 the cycle voucher is issued for a two-year period. Manchester City Council will not issue another cycle voucher or replacement travel pass in the following academic year.

In order to be issued with a cycle voucher the child must fall into any one of Groups 1, 2 or 3 as detailed above and have completed Bikeability Level 2 (ask in school about taking the test if your child has not already done so).

A replacement voucher or free travel pass will not be issued in the event of theft or loss of the bicycle. A replacement free travel pass will not be issued if the child no longer wishes to cycle to school. It remains the parent's responsibility to ensure that the child travels to and attends school.

What if my child loses their travel pass?

If your child has already received a free travel pass, do not fill in this form. Replacement passes can be obtained from TfGM. Please contact them on 0161 244 1050 or concessionary.travel@tfgm.com

What happens next?

If your application has been successful, the free travel pass/cycle voucher will be sent to your child's school for collection. The school will advise you of its arrival. If your application is unsuccessful and free travel/cycle pass is refused, you will be notified by letter, the letter will also contain information of what to do next if you are unhappy with the decision as you have the right to appeal.

Any applications received after 31 July 2025, will be available for collection from the school at the start of September, or approximately 20 working days after the form arrives at the School Admissions office.

If you have been refused a Free Travel Pass, you cannot apply again in the same academic year unless you have had a change in your circumstances, for instance a change of address.

Refunds

Where we are unable to process your free travel pass application within a 4-week period, a refund may be issued for travel expenses incurred for travel after the 4-week processing period and up to the time the pass arrives at your child's school. The refund will only be issued on receipt of evidence of your child's travel details, therefore only the original travel tickets/receipts will be accepted as evidence for a refund purpose. Only partial cost of a weekly ticket will be refunded if your child did not attend school or qualify on any of the dates claimed for. A 20 day processing period will not be included in any refund given.

A refund will not be provided if

- the parent failed to provide the correct documents or photograph at the time of submitting the application which lead to the delay of issuing a pass;
- the school lost/damaged the pass; or
- the school delayed giving the pass to the child.
