
Self-assessed health draws together an individual's perception of all aspects of their health and wellbeing and is a useful indicator of general well-being, health-related quality of life, the experience of long-term illness and the relative risks of future admission to hospital, impairment and mortality. Monitoring levels of general health over time is important for determining fitness for work, need for care and benefits and social capital.



A question on self-assessed general health was included in both the 2001 and 2011 Census, although the guestion asked in 2001 differed from that asked in 2011 making direct comparisons difficult. However, ONS have produced simulated results that give an indication of changes to the general health of the population over the last decade. These figures suggest that Manchester has seen a 2.5 percentage point increase in its rate of 'Good' general health compared with 2011.

People in some parts of Manchester experience substantially worse self reported general health than others. The areas of Manchester that have the highest proportions of people who reported bad or very bad health (13.0% and higher) are listed below. At the opposite side of the spectrum, there are 9 LSOAs where less than 1.0% of people report bad/very bad health. When looking at these figures it is important to remember that this measure is very strongly related to age and that areas with older populations are more likely to have higher rates of poor general health than areas with younger populations, irrespective of the underlying levels of ill health in the area.
