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1. 2011 Census migration - summary

1.1 Background

This topic paper contains information on the first tranche of origin-destination migration statistics from the 2011 Census, a complex set of data looking at the origin of residents, that is, where they lived one year before Census day and the destination of migrants, that is, where they moved to from Manchester. Additional characteristics in this release include their age, health, tenure and economic activity.

Census forms were completed by people living in the UK on 27 March 2011. There is no Census data on anyone emigrating from the UK in the year before the Census (the 2011 Registrar General's Mid-Year Population Estimate suggests that around 8,400 people left Manchester for overseas between 1 July 2010 and 30 June 2011).

1.2 General migration

56,925 people moved within the city in the year before Census day (27 March 2011), including those aged under 1. 52,253 people moved into Manchester in the year preceding the 2011 Census. 31,644 people moved out of Manchester to the rest of the UK in the year before the Census.

1.3 Origin

Of the 52,253 moves into Manchester, 38,752 (74.2%) came from elsewhere in the UK and 13,501 (25.8%) came from overseas, mainly Pakistan, China and India. Almost a quarter (12,347) of moves into Manchester came from the other nine Greater Manchester (GM) districts and a further 6,473 (12.4%) moves came from the rest of the North West.

Over three quarters of in-migrants from overseas moved into private rented accommodation and almost half of overseas in-migrants aged 16 and over were students.

1.4 UK destinations

Of the 31,644 moves from Manchester to the rest of the UK, 13,817 (43.7%) went to one of the other nine GM districts. Almost three quarters of out-migrants from Manchester (to elsewhere within the UK) aged 16 and over were students.

2. Moves within Manchester

2.1 Age and sex of internal movers

56,925 people moved within Manchester in the year preceding the 2011 Census, accounting for 11.3% of all residents in the city in 2011.

48.3% of residents moving within Manchester were female, while 51.7% were male. **Table 1** shows that adults between the age of 20 and 44 accounted for 72.8% of all residents moving within the city, compared to the city average in this age group of 47%. Of these, 51.7% were male and 48.3% were female.

2.2 Characteristics of migrants moving within the city

Characteristics data of in-migrants relates to those aged 1 and over. Of the 56,350 people moving within Manchester in the year before the Census, 51.4% were not in a family and aged under 65, while 23% were in a couple family. Only 5.1% were not in a household and 4.5% were lone parents.

89.5% of movers stated that they were in 'good' or 'very good' health, with only 0.8% in 'very bad' health. 4.1% had health problems which limited their day-to-day activities a lot and a further 4.5% had their activities limited a little.

Over two-thirds of movers (67.9%) were in private rented accommodation, with 18.2% in the social-rented sector and one in 10 in owner-occupied tenure.

Just under 60% of all people aged 16 and over moving within Manchester were economically active and just under a third (31.1%) were in full-time employment with another 1.4% employed full-time but also full-time students. 28.8% were students (economically inactive) and only 2.2% were retired.

17.2% of movers aged 16 and over in employment the week prior to the Census were employed in the wholesale and retail trade, followed by 14.6% in accommodation and food service activities, 12.4% in human health and social work and 10.3% in education.

Of the 49,256 migrants aged 16 and over moving within Manchester, the NS-SeC of 42.9% was categorised as 'full-time student', with 9.3% in lower professional and higher technical occupations, 8.4% in semi-routine occupations and 8% in intermediate occupations.

2.3 Migrants moving within the city by ward

In general, people moving within Manchester tended to move locally within the same ward (**Table A1 in Appendix**). Over 40% of residents migrating within the city from Miles Platting and Newton Heath, Cheetham, Baguley and Sharston moved within the same ward. Over 1,000 people in City Centre and Withington moved within the same ward.

3. Origin of people moving into Manchester

3.1 Age and sex of in-migrants

There were 38,752 people who moved to Manchester from the rest of the UK and 13,501 who moved to the city from overseas. Of those 52,253 in-migrants, there were slightly more males (52.7%) than females (47.3%).

Almost seven out of every 10 (68.1%) in-migrants were aged 20 to 44, 7.7% were children under the age of 16 and 1% were aged 65 or over (**Table 2**).

31.9% of 25-44s moved from elsewhere in Greater Manchester (Salford, Trafford and Stockport) and 28.3% came from outside the UK (**Table 3**). While 46.5% of under 1s originated within Greater Manchester (over 10% each from Salford and Trafford), 23.6% came from abroad. A higher percentage of migrants aged 16 to 24 came from the rest of England outside the North West (44.0%) and overseas (22.7%), compared to only 14.4% from the rest of Greater Manchester. Of the 511 people of retirement age moving into Manchester, over half were aged between 65 and 74. Over 10% of 65-74s came from Trafford and the North West outside Greater Manchester, while 19% came from overseas. 41 people aged 90 and over moved into the city in the year before the Census, mainly from Trafford (19.5%), Stockport (12.2%) and the rest of the North West outside Greater Manchester (17.1%).

Over a third (36%) of all in-migrants originated from elsewhere in the North West (**Table 3**), with the majority of those originating in Greater Manchester, many being students coming to study in Manchester. Just under a quarter (23.6%) of in-migrants came from one of the other nine GM

districts with over 2,000 each from Salford, Trafford and Stockport. Over a quarter (25.8%) of in-migrants came from outside the UK.



3.2 In-migrants from UK

There were 38,752 people who moved to Manchester from the rest of the UK and 13,501 who moved to the city from overseas (**Map 1**).

Table 4 shows that around 6.5% of in-migrants from the UK were children aged 0-15 and just over 1% were people of retirement age. Around a third were in the 20-24 age group and just over a third were aged between 25 and 44.

Table 5 shows the age of UK in-migrants where more than 200 came from each area. Over 50% of in-migrants from Salford and Trafford were aged 25-44, and over 40% were in this age group from the other Greater Manchester districts (apart from Wigan), Cheshire East and Liverpool. Almost half those moving from Edinburgh were aged 25-44. Of the 1,006 in-migrants from Oldham, 15.5% were children aged 0-15, compared to only 7.4% of those arriving from Salford. 3.5% of in-migrants Rochdale and 2.8% from Trafford were age 65 or over.

Most of the in-migrants to Manchester moved to City Centre (4,754), Hulme (3,166), Ardwick (2,842) and Fallowfield (2,683), the wards favoured by students (**Table A2 in Appendix**). Less than 300 people moved into Higher Blackley, Burnage and Charlestown. Not surprisingly, most of the in-migrants were from elsewhere in the North West (18,820). Just over 1 in ten (10.6%) migrating from elsewhere in the North West moved into City Centre, 6.8% moved into Hulme and 5.8% moved into Cheetham (**Table A3 in Appendix**).

3.3 Characteristics of in-migrants from the UK

Characteristics data of in-migrants relates to those aged 1 and over. Of the 12,219 in-migrants from the rest of Greater Manchester, 41.2% were not in a family and aged under 65 while 31.4% were in a couple family (**Table A4 in Appendix**). Only 9% were not in a household and 4% were lone parents. Of the 490 lone parents moving into Manchester, 21.2% came from Trafford and 19.8% moved from Stockport.

38.7% of the 26,323 migrants moving to Manchester from the rest of the UK were not in a family and aged under 65 and 36.6% were not in a household. Only 1.7% were lone parents.

Of all the in-migrants from the UL to Manchester, the highest proportion not in households (e.g. students) and in couple families and those not in a family but under the age of 65 came from elsewhere in the North West (**Table A5 in Appendix**).

88.7% of the 12,219 in-migrants from the nine Greater Manchester districts stated that they were in 'good' or 'very good' health, with only 0.8% in 'very bad' health. 4.2% had health problems which limited their day-to-day activities a lot and a further 4.9% had their activities limited a little. Of those moving into the city with the most limitation, around one in five came from Salford and 18.7% came from Trafford.

93.7% of the 26,323 in-migrants from the rest of the UK were in 'good' or 'very good' health and only 0.3% were in 'very bad' health. 95.6% did not experience any limitation in their day-to-day activities, and only 1.4% had their activities limited a lot.

Almost two-thirds of the 11,118 usual household resident in-migrants from Greater Manchester moved into private rented accommodation, with around a fifth in owner-occupied tenure and 11.9% in the social-rented sector. This pattern was similar in the 16,690 household resident migrants from the rest of the UK, but with over three-quarters moving into private rented accommodation.

Over three-quarters of the 11,000 people aged 16 and over migrating to Manchester from the rest of the county were economically active and around half were in full-time employment and another 1% were employed full-time but also full-time students. 11% were students (economically inactive) and only 2.5% were retired.

This contrasted with the 25,207 in-migrants aged 16+ from the rest of the UK, 37% of whom were economically inactive students, 28.9% were employed full-time with a further 1.2% in full-time employment but also full-time students. Highest numbers of students (economically inactive) moved from the North West outside Greater Manchester (1,640), Yorkshire and The Humber (1,281) and London (1,248).

17.7% of the 7,600 in-migrants aged 16 and over in employment the week prior to the Census and moving from elsewhere in Greater Manchester were employed in the wholesale and retail trade, followed by 11.9% in human health and social work and 10.7% in accommodation and food service activities.

Those moving from elsewhere in the UK in work in the week before the Census (11,986) were employed mainly in the wholesale and retail trade (19.4%), accommodation and food services (14.5%), human health and social work (10.9% and professional, scientific and technical activities (10.8%).

Of the 11,000 in-migrants aged 16 and over moving from the rest of Greater Manchester, the NS-SoC of 21.5% was categorised as 'full-time student', with 13.7% in lower professional and higher technical occupations, and 11.8% in intermediate occupations.

In contrast, 58% of the 25,207 from the rest of the UK were classified as full-time students, with only 9.7% in lower professional and higher technical occupations and 8% in higher professional occupations.

3.4 In-migrants from abroad

Almost one in 10 (9.9%) of the 13,501 in-migrants from overseas came from Pakistan, followed by 8.8% from China (**Table 6**). India, Nigeria, Spain, France and the United States each accounted for 3% or more (at least 400 people) of in-migrants from abroad.

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Table 7 shows that children aged 0-15 accounted for 11% of in-migrants from abroad. Only 0.6% were people of retirement age while a third were aged between 20 and 24 and around two in five were aged between 25 and 44.

Whereas 67.4% of in-migrants from China were aged between 20 and 24, only 12.3% of those from Nigeria were in this age group (**Table A6 in Appendix**). Conversely, only 2.3% of in-migrants from Australia and China were children under 16, compared to 29.1% of in-migrants from North Africa. Over half of migrants from Nigeria, Australia and South America were aged between 25 and 44 compared to only 14.7% from China and 19% from Malaysia. In the older age groups, around 1 in ten of in-migrants from Ireland and Spain were aged 45-64, with very low percentages of retirement age from all countries.

Most of the in-migrants from overseas moved to City Centre (1,692), Ardwick (1,307) and Hulme (1,065). The highest proportions of overseas in-migrants to these wards came from China and were likely to be students (**Table A7 in Appendix**). Over 20% of all the in-migrants from abroad to Cheetham, Crumpsall, Levenshulme, Burnage, Longsight and Gorton South moved from Pakistan. Less than 100 people moved from abroad into Brooklands, Woodhouse Park, Baguley, Moston, Higher Blackley and Charlestown.

Whereas Chinese in-migrants tended to move to Ardwick and City Centre, Pakistani in-migrants moved to Longsight, Cheetham and Gorton South, while Indian in-migrants moved into Ardwick, Cheetham, Rusholme and Moss Side (**Table A8 in Appendix**).

3.5 Characteristics of in-migrants from abroad

Characteristics data for in-migrants relates to those aged 1 and over. Of the 13,436 people moving into Manchester from overseas in the year before the Census, 39.6% were not in a family and aged under 65, while 21.2% were in a couple family. 24% were not in a household and 8% were dependent children of parents in a couple family. Only 1.7% were lone parents.

95% of foreign migrants stated that they were in 'good' or 'very good' health, with only 0.4% in 'very bad' health. Only 0.9% had health problems which limited their day-to-day activities a lot (127 people) and a further 2.2% (297) had their activities limited a little.

Over three quarters (76.9%) of the 10,213 overseas in-migrants in households were in private rented accommodation, with 8.1% in the social-rented sector and 12.3% in owner-occupied tenure. Over 85% of migrants from the Netherlands, Romania, Poland, Central America and India were in

private rented accommodation compared to only two thirds of Chinese in-migrants. Over 10% of migrants from Ireland, North Africa, Italy, Nigeria, China, Iran and 'Other' South and Eastern Africa were in the social-rented sector compared to only 1.9% from Lithuania. The owner occupied sector was favoured by over 15% of migrants from China, Canada, Australia, Pakistan and 'Other' South-East Asia compared to only 4.7% from Romania (**Table A9 in Appendix**).

42.5% of the 12,015 people aged 16 and over moving to Manchester from abroad were economically active and 17.6% were in full-time employment with another 1.2% employed full-time but also full-time students. 48.1% were students (economically inactive) and only 0.9% were retired (**Table A10 in Appendix**).

17.7% of the 3,618 movers from overseas aged 16 and over in employment the week prior to the Census were employed in accommodation and food service activities, 14.3% in the wholesale and retail trade and 10.5% in education.

Of the 12,015 migrants from abroad aged 16 and over moving to Manchester, the NS-SeC of 61% was categorised as 'full-time student', with 8.7% as never worked or long-term unemployed, 5.5% in higher professional occupations and 5.1% in lower professional and higher technical occupations (**Table 11 in Appendix**).

4. Out migration

4.1 Age and sex of out-migrants


There is no information on migrants who were resident in Manchester on Census day, but have now left the UK.

The majority of the 31,644 people leaving tended to remain close to the city, moving across its boundaries to neighbouring local authorities. Slightly under half (43.7%) of people leaving Manchester moved to one of the other nine local authorities in Greater Manchester. Of those moving elsewhere in Greater Manchester, Trafford attracted almost a quarter, followed by Salford and Stockport (**Table 9** and **Map 2**). 13.4% of all out-migrants moved to districts outside Greater Manchester but still within the North West region. Cheshire East, Cheshire West and Chester, and Warrington were each the destination for over 1% of out-migrants from Manchester. London was the destination of 11% of people leaving the city, with Liverpool, Leeds, Birmingham and Sheffield the destination for over 400 people each.

Children aged 0 to 15 accounted for 11.3% of all out-migrants (**Table 10**). 60.7% of all 0-15 out-migrants moved elsewhere within Greater Manchester while 11.3% moved to other districts within the North West region. 15.6% of all moves from Manchester to the rest of Greater Manchester were made by children under the age of 16 (**Table 10**).

28.4% of all out-migrants were aged 20 to 24. 28% moved to the rest of the county, while 58.6% moved outside the North West. 18.2% of all moves from Manchester to the rest of Greater Manchester and 38.8% of all moves elsewhere in the UK outside the North West were made by 20-24 year olds.

25 to 44 year olds accounted for 46.4% of all out-migrants. Almost half of them (49%) moved elsewhere in Greater Manchester, 13.2% went to the rest of the North West and 37.8% moved elsewhere in the UK. 52% of all moves from Manchester to the rest of Greater Manchester and two in five moves (40.9%) to elsewhere in the UK outside the North West were made by this age group.

2.1% of out-migrants were aged 65 and over. 53.4% of this age group remained within Greater Manchester while 18% moved to the rest of the North West and 28.6% moved to the rest of the UK outside the North West. 2.5% of all moves from Manchester to the rest of Greater Manchester were made by those aged 65 and over.

Table 11 shows the age of out-migrants to the UK where more than 200 moved to each district. Over half of out-migrants to Trafford, Stockport, Bolton, Salford and Bury in Greater Manchester, and Cheshire East, Cheshire West and Chester, Warrington, High Peak, Lambeth, Southwark, Hackney and Wandsworth were aged 25 to 44.

4.2 Characteristics of out-migrants to the UK

There were 31,339 usual residents aged 1 and over with a different address a year before the Census who left Manchester, 43.5% of whom moved to a district in Greater Manchester and 56.5% who moved elsewhere in the UK. A third (10,332) of residents moving out of the city were

in couple families and 14.8% went to Trafford, 11.4% went to Stockport, 10.3% went to Salford and 12.7% moved to districts in the North West outside Greater Manchester.

Of the 13,619 out-migrants to the rest of Greater Manchester, 41.6% were in a couple family, while 27.9% were in not a family and aged under 65. Only 2.7% were not in a household and 5% were lone parents (**Tables A14 and A15 in Appendix**). Of the 5,669 residents in couple families moving from Manchester into other districts in Greater Manchester, 27% moved to Trafford, 20.7% went to Stockport and 18.8% went to Salford.

17,720 residents moved elsewhere in the UK, 29.9% of whom were not in a family and aged under 65, 26.3% were in a couple family and 16.9% were dependent children in couple families. 11% were not in a household and only 2% were lone parents. 28% of couple families moving elsewhere in the UK stayed within the North West, moving mainly to Cheshire East, Warrington and Cheshire West and Chester. 19.9% moved to London and 10.0% went to Yorkshire and the Humber.

88.1% of out-migrants to the nine Greater Manchester districts stated that they were in 'good' or 'very good' health, with only 0.8% in 'very bad' health. 4.8% had health problems which limited their day-to-day activities a lot and a further 5.4% had their activities limited a little. Of the 656 moving out of the city to Greater Manchester with the most limitation, 16.5% went to Stockport, 15.4% went to Trafford and 15.2% each went to Salford and Tameside.

90.5% of out-migrants to the rest of the UK were in 'good' or 'very good' health and only 0.6% were in 'very bad' health. 93.6% did not experience any limitation in their day-to-day activities, and only 2.7% had their activities limited a lot.

Just over half (51.8%) out-migrants to Greater Manchester moved into private rented accommodation, with 35% moving to owner-occupied tenure and 11% to the social-rented sector. This pattern was similar in migrants moving to the rest of the UK, but with 40.6% moving to owner occupation and only 6.7% moving into the social rented sector.

Almost one in four (79.7%) of all people aged 16 and over migrating from Manchester to the rest of the county were economically active and over half (56.2%) were in full-time employment and another 0.9% were employed full-time but also full-time students. 6% were students (economically inactive) and only 3.3% were retired.

A larger percentage of out-migrants to the rest of the UK were economically inactive students (15%), 48.1% were employed full-time with a further 2% in full-time employment but also full-time students. Highest numbers of full-time employees (not full-time students) moved to Cheshire East (505), Leeds (206), Liverpool (185), Cheshire West and Chester (181), Warrington (180), Lambeth (173) and Birmingham (168).

15% of out-migrants aged 16 and over in employment the week prior to the Census and moving into another Greater Manchester district were employed in the wholesale and retail trade, followed by 13.6% in human health and social work and 10.4% in professional, scientific and technical activities.

Those moving elsewhere in the UK were employed mainly in the wholesale and retail trade (14.6%), human health and social work (13.7%), professional, scientific and technical activities (11.9%) and education (10.2%).

Of the 11,661 out-migrants aged 16 and over moving from Manchester to the rest of the county, the NS-SeC of 16.2% was categorised as lower professional and higher technical occupations, with 13.2% in intermediate occupations.

In contrast, 23.6% moving outside Greater Manchester to the rest of the UK were classified as full-time students, 16.4% in lower professional and higher technical occupations and 14.5% in higher professional occupations.
