1.lt is ONS policy to publish population estimates rounded to at least the nearest hundred persons.

These unit-level estimates are provided to enable and encourage further calculations and analysis.

However, the estimates cannot be guaranteed to be as exact as the level of detail implied by unit-level data.

We request that data are rounded to the nearest 100 if quoted in any publication, documentation or similar.

2. The estimated resident population of an area includes all those people who usually live there, regardless of nationality.

Arriving international migrants are included in the usually resident population if they remain in the UK for at least a year.

Emigrants are excluded if they remain outside the UK for at least a year.

This is consistent with the United Nations definition of a long-term migrant.

Armed forces stationed outside of the UK are excluded. Students are taken to be usually resident at their term time address.

3. At a subnational level, the population estimates reflect boundaries in place as of the reference year.
