




#### Q4: How do you get to this pharmacy?



# Q7: What is your first language?





### Q8: Did you know staff could provide advice of treating minor ailments?





## Q9: Are you provide with sufficient information about your medication?









### Q12: How often do you use any pharmacy?





## Q13: Do you order on the internet, by mail or by phone?





# Q17: Did you know about extended hours?





# Q18: Do you know where these pharmacies are?





# Q19: Have you used a pharmacy during extended hours?





## Q20: When would you or did you find a pharmacy with extended hours useful?





### Q21: Do you have any difficulties travelling to pharmacies near you?





### Q22: How far would you be willing to travel to a pharmacy?





### Q23: Do you have any difficulties accessing pharmacies near you?




